Survey Says...

I hate surveys. You know how these days everyone wants to know how they're doing? You get a survey link in an email for everything from buying a cup of coffee to buying a car. I hate taking the time to do them. That is, of course, unless I am mad. If I got bad customer service, had to wait too long, or feel like I got ripped off, then I'm clicking on the link and giving them a piece of my mind. A few years ago after purchasing new cell phones when changing carriers—I won't mention the carrier—I got that dreaded survey. The salesman had lied to me. I was furious. So, I clicked and let it rip. I even filled in a paragraph in the section where they ask you if you want to add anything. I was sure that a manager was going to call me, or even that they would offer me some kind of restitution. Nothing. No call. No rebate. Not even a text to say they were sorry and they had fired that salesman. Do they even read those surveys?

Well, if you hate surveys like I do, I hope you will suspend that hatred for one particular survey. On January 9 you will get an email from the church with a link to a survey. Don't worry, it won't take too long to answer it. There are only five questions. They are all open-ended questions so you can answer them however you wish. What is different about this survey is that it is not a satisfaction survey. What we're looking for is how you experience St. Andrew's, what you see as our most important ministries, features, or characteristics. We want to hear from everyone. Whether you've been a member here for decades or you are relatively new, your responses are important. At the heart of the survey is to find out what you most value about St. Andrew's, what attracted you here in the first place and why you stay. Of course, there are no wrong answers. All points of view are valid.

Once the surveys are complete, our consultants, the Vandersall Collective, will compile the answers along with other information they've gathered, and process them into a set of core values for our parish. These will be presented to the vestry at a retreat in late February and finalized. Those core values will be used to create an instrument they call a strategic filter, a kind of matrix for decision making that we can employ at all levels of parish life that is intended to keep us focused on those core values.

Now, if you are angry or dissatisfied about something, this survey is not the venue to voice your complaints. My email inbox is always open for your feedback, positive or negative, and I guarantee I'll read it.

So, when you get that survey link, please click on it. Tell us what is on your heart and mind. If you are more comfortable filling out a survey on paper, that will be an option too. We really do want everyone's participation. This is a really important effort, and we can't do it without you. Help us to keep St. Andrew's moving forward in 2024 and beyond. Your input will help shape our common life for the foreseeable future.

December 2023

The vestry met on December 12 in room 324. Father Jeff informed the vestry that the search for a nursery room attendant is still ongoing. This is someone who will be in attendance every Sunday morning in the nursery for about 2 hours. St. Andrew's treasurer noted that the income for the Church was down a little in November, but that the donations in December often offset that deficit. There have been advanced pledges of ~\$31,000 which will remain in the savings account until January. As of December. 4, St. Andrew's had ~100 pledges totaling \$293,582.00 for 2024.

There was much discussion about the 2024 Budget for St. Andrew's and the impact of strategic planning with the Vandersall Collective.

Andrea McCloskey and Carolyn Donaldson were approved to the Community Café Board. They will replace outgoing members Grace Pilato and Scott Thomas. We thank them for their service. Ann Gibboney and Bob Jones were approved to become stewards for the Parishioners' Ministry. They will replace Wendi Keeler and Sarah Klinetob-Lowe. We thank them for their service.

The vestry meets on the second Tuesday of each month. The next meeting is on January 9 at 7 p.m. in room 324. All are welcome.

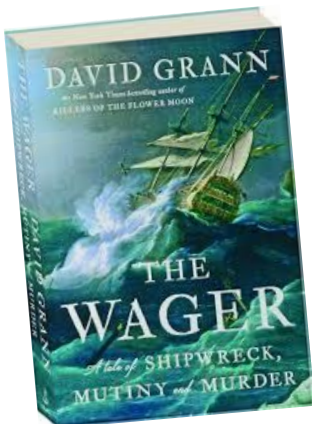
BOOK CLUB
