Hopefully by now you have heard that I am taking a sabbatical this summer. If not, well, I am taking a sabbatical this summer. Now, I know what you're thinking: great, we can take the summer off from church too. But that would be a mistake. All the usual stuff is still going on this summer. All three services will happen every Sunday. The Community Café meals will go on every Thursday. It is not true that Episcopalians are the only group that God trusts to take the summer off. I'm counting on all of you to show up this summer.

While I'm gone, Father Ted Christopher will be leading most, but not all, of the services. We will have other supply clergy too, including familiar faces like Father Kevin Barron and Mother Eileen Weglarz. Ted will also be providing pastoral support for the equivalent of one day per week. He will be available for emergencies. You will be in good hands.

In the Episcopal Church, when the rector is not available, the Senior Warden becomes the one responsible for running the parish, with the Junior Warden as the second in charge. We are blessed to have two very capable wardens in Sandy Schwartz and Andrea McCloskey. They will be making sure that everything runs smoothly. But truly St. Andrew's runs itself. Our amazing staff will be doing their jobs, and they will continue to meet once a week to communicate and coordinate their efforts. We have an awesome team, and I trust them 100%.

It would be wrong, I believe, to think of the summer as a time when St. Andrew's will be on hold, or treading water, or marking time. Based on my experience of a previous sabbatical, I am confident that good things will happen while the rector is away. God will continue to be worshiped here and will continue to work in, with, and through the congregation. I look forward to the second week in September when I will return and will share my stories of what God has been doing in my life all summer with you. And I will be excited to hear your stories about how God has been at work in your lives, as individuals and as a congregation.
