Try Silence for a Change

I had a wonderful experience in early May. For seven days, I attended a contemplative prayer workshop at Holy Cross Monastery in West Park, NY. During this retreat, we lived the monastic rhythm – mostly – participating in the five daily services of the order, keeping silent at meals, practicing the custody of the eyes... a particularly tricky thing for me to do, especially in silence, to resist the urge to make eye contact with passers-by, wanting to check in, smile, give a little wink, a little self-assurance of connection or friendliness even. Custody of the eyes presumes that all are always in contemplation, and that it would be a disruption of that contemplation even to expect eye contact!

And we engaged in contemplative prayer – three hours per day. For those of you who have never done such a thing, I can assure you that it is a unique experience. I have done what I would loosely define as contemplative prayer for a while, trying to carve out 10 or 15 minutes here or there for silence, especially around or before worship – but never this intensive or intentional, and never with a group of people. Sitting in silence for hours with 12 strangers is quite something, I can assure you.

For one thing, silence creates a lot of noise. Of course, there's the exterior noise that you notice right away... the sounds of the room, people breathing, stomachs gurgling... the sounds of a creaky old building, the sounds of a nest of birds in the eaves outside the window. And then there is the interior noise – the random thoughts and ideas that burst into your mind. These could indeed be random, but more often, at least for me, they tended to have to do with the action itself – am I doing this right? Should my breathing be more rhythmic? My nose itches – should I scratch it? Is the person next to me falling asleep? Am I falling asleep?

For another thing, contemplative prayer tends to dredge up deeper thoughts – anyone who has tried meditation knows this. This is the commentary of the conscience – the self-criticism or self-congratulation that we all engage in. It is the expectation that something profound will happen in the next 30 minutes of silence – which is usually frustrated – or it is the anticipation that nothing will happen, that the whole thing is pointless – which usually robs anyone of wanting to continue at all.

Contemplative prayer – any prayer, really – is hard. But does it have to be? Jesus, in the Gospels, teaches us that, when we pray, we are to go into our rooms and pray in secret, and the Father who is in secret will hear us. Jesus tells us to pray simply and modestly, not to make a show of it. I can't think of anything more simple or modest than sitting in absolute silence, with no words or thoughts, doing nothing more than contemplating God.

So, try silence for a change! Find a comfortable, quiet spot, set a timer (maybe start with 20 minutes), pick a short phrase or word that signals your consent to enter the contemplation of God, and then...go! As your attention wanders, return to the phrase or word, gently and kindly. At the very least, you will have 20 minutes of peace and quiet... at the very best, you will contemplate the presence of God. Either way, not bad!

Notice of Intent to Amend St. Andrew's Bylaws

June 24, 2025

(Some text below is excerpted from a letter from our Vestry wardens. Please use the link below to read the entire letter.)

The Vestry (Father Jeff and twelve elected members) is proposing some changes in the church's Bylaws and Governing Documents. The major change involves a reordering of the articles in our current Bylaws, as well as a few updates and minor points of clarification, to conform to the guidelines of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, our Parliamentary authority. The Bylaws were last amended in 2022, with two appendices added in 2024.

In accordance with the current Bylaws, a copy of the revised Bylaws containing the proposed amendments was posted on the bulletin board outside Canterbury Hall on June 24, two weeks before the Vestry will vote to adopt them. Please see below for links to digital versions of the **current** Bylaws, the proposed **amended** Bylaws, and a **letter from our wardens**, Sandy Schwartz and Andrea McCloskey.






