Extend Grace - No Matter What.

A few Sunday mornings ago, we were visited by a small group of protesters outside our church. They shouted out slogans and quoted Bible verses (out of context, of course), the gist of which was that homosexuality is a sin and any church or individual which thinks otherwise is headed for the fires of eternal conscious torment. These protesters did not impede or obstruct access to the church, which would be illegal – but they came close. More to their point, they made some folks feel uncomfortable and unsafe walking through the front door – especially families with children, and members of the LGBTQ+ community coming to worship with us. I must confess that I took a little inappropriate satisfaction in the knowledge that their protest was encumbered by a providentially timed downpour about 5 minutes after Service began (Soli Deo Gloria).

Some may wonder, why do they bother our church? They bother us because we fly a Pride banner. They bother us because we are a church that affirms the God-givenness and God-giftedness of everyone, regardless of who they love or who they are (that includes the protestors, too!). They bother us because they have decided that God hates the people they hate, which is a grievous sin. It can be tempting to write these people off – to recoil from their bigotry and hatred with judgement and defensiveness of our own. Of course, this would make us the same as them. We must take the harder path – we must extend grace. This is not to say, for one second, that we would ever fail to assert the full humanity and full incorporation into the Body of Christ of LGBTQ+ people – God forbid! Extending grace to all, especially to those who do not do the same, does not condone the behavior. Extending grace is for the health of OUR souls, and OUR redemption. Extending grace is the root of Christian love. It is the discipline of our faith – a discipline because it is hard. But it is the work we are given to do.

Of course, in the end, our service a few weeks ago proceeded undisturbed. We gathered as we do each Sunday, hearing the Word of God, saying our prayers, confessing our sins, and most importantly, receiving the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. We did all this in a service presided over by a priest who we all love and who brings the integrity of his whole identity to his ministry in the church. Thanks be to God.

We live in such perilous times, exacerbated by a digital and political culture that thrives on division. The church must rise above it. The church – OUR church – must be a place where all are welcome. It breaks our hearts to think that for many in the world today, the church looks more like those protesters outside our doors a few weeks ago. We know that's not the truth, but we do have our work cut out for us. We will continue to witness to the love of Christ in the world. We will continue to seek and serve Him in all persons (even the protesters). We will continue to strive for justice and peace among all people, respecting the dignity of every human being. We will do all this – and more... the hard work of the church, which extends grace, no matter what, to a broken and hurting world.


We trust that this period of rest, reflection, and renewal will bear fruit for him and his family, as well as for the parish which he continues to serve.

Our judge this year, the **Rev. Dr. Vincent Joseph Kopp**, entered our contest last year and has a poem in our anthology, *And Who Is My Neighbor?*. Dr. Kopp is a writer and poet who is also a medical doctor certified in pediatrics and anesthesiology and an Episcopal priest. His poems have appeared or are forthcoming in journals as varied as *Crescent Review, DoubleTake, The Journal of Medical Humanities, Southern Cultures, Anesthesia and Analgesia, Christian Century*, to name a few. As a faculty member at UNC Chapel Hill, he


taught a course called "Medical Ethics and Literature," was a Chapman Fellow at Institute for the Arts and Humanities and helped students start two other journals focused on medicine and the humanities, *iris* and *Health Humanities Journal*. After retiring from medicine in 2016, he was ordained in the Episcopal Church in 2018 and served in North Carolina parishes for five years, retiring in 2023. He now devotes time to gardening, publishing poems, and assembling two books of poems.

Our bishop, **The Rt. Rev. Audrey C. Scanlan**, was ordained and consecrated as the eleventh bishop of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania in 2015. Audrey relocated from Connecticut where she serviced on the diocesan staff as Canon for Mission Collaboraton and Congregational Life. Before that, Audrey was the Rector of two yoked congregations in central Connecticut and two other local congregations in her ministerial life. She has a particular interest in congregational vitality, creative and adaptive use of church buildings, local mission, and community engagement. Audrey is the co-founder of Rhythms of Grace, a worship and formation program for children with special needs and holds a doctorate in the Theology of Disability. Audrey and her husband, Glenn, have been married since 1984 and are parents to three adult children – Emma, William, and Harriet. Hiking, cooking, running, and playing the cello are among Audrey's hobbies. We are grateful that Audrey was able to work judging our contest this year into her challenging schedule.


Make plans to join us on Sunday, September 7, following the 10 a.m. service for a picnic at Holmes Foster Park.
