New Beginnings

A new year is a time for new beginnings. This year we are part of a brand-new diocese, and we welcome a new member of our staff.

We are now a parish in the Episcopal Diocese of the Susquehanna, the result of the reunification of the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania (our old diocese) and the Diocese of Bethlehem. This change became effective on January first, and it was the result of years of work between the two dioceses. We now have two bishops. The Rt. Rev. Audrey C. Scanlan is our bishop diocesan, meaning she is the chief bishop. The Rt. Rev. Kevin D. Nichols is our bishop suffragan, meaning he is like an assistant bishop. When Bishop Scanlan retires the plan is for Bishop Nichols to be our provisional bishop, which is like an interim bishop, until we elect a new diocesan. Then we will be a diocese with only one bishop. For now, we realize that this is still a time of transition. So, we expect that there will be growing pains, that we will get some things wrong until we work out all the details. In the short term, we beg your patience during this year as we figure out how life will be as the reunified diocese of the Susquehanna.

We have a new person on the church staff. Reed Dressler is the Director of Family Ministry. Look for an article in this newsletter in which Reed introduces himself. Formerly we had a Director of Children's Ministry and a Director of Youth Ministry. We've decided to go in a slightly new direction. Family Ministry encompasses the traditional children's and youth ministries such as Sunday School and Youth Group, but it broadens the focus to include families and intergenerational activities. We define Family Ministry as follows: strengthening and supporting families, empowering families in their Christian faith formation, connecting all generations within St. Andrew's as they journey with Christ and one another. Look for Reed and be sure to welcome him to our parish family.

With the addition of Reed as our Director of Family Ministry, we say farewell to Sarah Skvarla who served as our interim Director of Children's Ministry. Sarah did a great job! She's not going anywhere, but the job she held down temporarily has been subsumed into Family Ministry. Thank you so much, Sarah, for your faithful service to our parish. We appreciate all that you did to keep us going through the interim. Sarah also served on the search committee that worked with me as we defined the new position and interviewed potential candidates. I want to thank all of them: Marisa Ferger, Jason McCloskey, Darlene Nordoff, Laura Potts, and Sarah Skvarla, with Katie Gaines who served as the committee's vestry liaison. We were a good team, and we all look forward to the great things Reed will be doing with us.

Twenty-twenty-six promises to be a great year. We start it off with some exciting new possibilities!

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 25. We will gather in the church after a short break following the 10:00 a.m. service. If you cannot attend in person, the meeting will be live streamed on Facebook. If those viewing at home have a question or a comment, they can type it into the comments.



To vote on any issues presented during the Annual Meeting, such as Vestry elections, you must be a qualified elector. Below is a brief review of these qualifications:

- Electors in the parish are adult communicants in good standing. (Parish Bylaws: Article II, Section 1)
- Adult = 16 years old or older
- Communicant in good standing = All communicants of this Church who for the previous year have “been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and have been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God,” are to be considered communicants in good standing.

MELANIE MILLER FOSTER



I have been a member of St. Andrew's since 2013 who finds deep meaning in our church's commitment to service. I am especially inspired by the mission of the Community Café. In my professional life I study global food insecurity, so seeing our parish actively support food access and fellowship in the local community resonates deeply with both my values and my work.

I attend the 5:00 p.m. service where I appreciate the wonderful sense of community and the chance it gives me to recenter as I prepare for the week ahead. I am grateful for the opportunity to run for vestry and hope to contribute to the welcoming and service-oriented spirit that makes St. Andrew's such a special place.

ADOLPH HOEHLING



I hope to bring my lifetime of professional and personal experience to service as a St. Andrew's Vestry member. I was confirmed as an Episcopalian when a teenager at St. Alban's Episcopal in Cape Elizabeth, Maine. Following undergraduate and graduate training at American University (Washington, DC), Yale University (New Haven, CT), and Thunderbird Graduate School of International Business (Glendale, AZ), I served as an officer with Citibank of New York and then the Bank of Boston in several posts in Asia, Latin America, and the USA. I then served as a commercial bank examiner and regulatory supervisor with the FDIC in Florida, California, and Georgia, retiring in North Carolina in 2010.

During most of my career, I actively attended and supported several Episcopal parishes in the USA and abroad, including Manila, Philippines, So. Brunswick, NJ, and Providence, RI. I served in parish finance and vestry roles during that time. Following retirement, my spiritual journey turned to the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) for about 10 years, worshipping at Friends' Meetings in North Carolina and in State College, PA, until early 2023, when I began worshipping at St. Andrew's Episcopal. Following study at an adult confirmation class led by Father Jeff, I participated in a service of Reaffirmation officiated by Bishop Audrey Scanlan in April 2024. During 2024 I served on the Church Finance Committee.

My retirement has been richly filled with volunteer work with, among others, the Mid-State Literacy Council and the PA Prison Society, as well as with priceless hours in play with my three grandchildren residing here in State College. Thankful for the spiritual community I have found here, I pray that I may share a few of the lessons from my eight-decades journey with my fellow parishioners of this Church and Diocese.

ELIZABETH JENKINS



I grew up as Anglican in England and moved to the US in 1980 when my husband Philip took a job at Penn State. We have two adult daughters.

I have been a member of St Andrew's since the late 1980s when a kind mother (still a member of the congregation) took my daughter off to Sunday School so that I could participate in the service. I served on the vestry at two earlier points and that gave me the chance to observe many changes in the church's practice, and how it has defined the experience of being church.

I am very interested in how our church has been changing in the decades since that first Sunday and I am eager to be involved again with the challenge of planning the future. St Andrew's is very different from the stereotype of too many Episcopal congregations, which seem locked in a cycle of decline. By comparison we are doing very well: I have been excited to see the stream of new people joining the church in recent years and to hear their questions and ideas about our congregation.

On the wider stage, our diocese is beginning a new chapter, and I think we are ready to figure out where St Andrew's fits in that bigger puzzle. On a personal level I retired from my job with the English Department at Penn State a couple of years ago. I worked closely with undergraduate and graduate students, so I am still very interested in their lives in a changing town.

DAVID POTTS



I joined the Episcopal Church in 2011 while living in South Carolina. My wife Laura and I then moved back to our home state of Pennsylvania, where we joined St. John's Episcopal Church in Carlisle. There, I served on the Vestry for three years, including one year in the Junior Warden role, and helped to manage several physical improvements to the church building. Since moving to State College in 2022, we have been members of St. Andrew's. Our daughters, Madeleine and Genevieve, were baptized in the Episcopal church in 2019 and 2024, respectively.

I wish to serve on the Vestry to help St. Andrew's remain a place where families grow in faith. As a parent, I care about teaching my children the importance of compassion and service, and I believe the church plays a vital role in shaping these values while supporting the wider community. 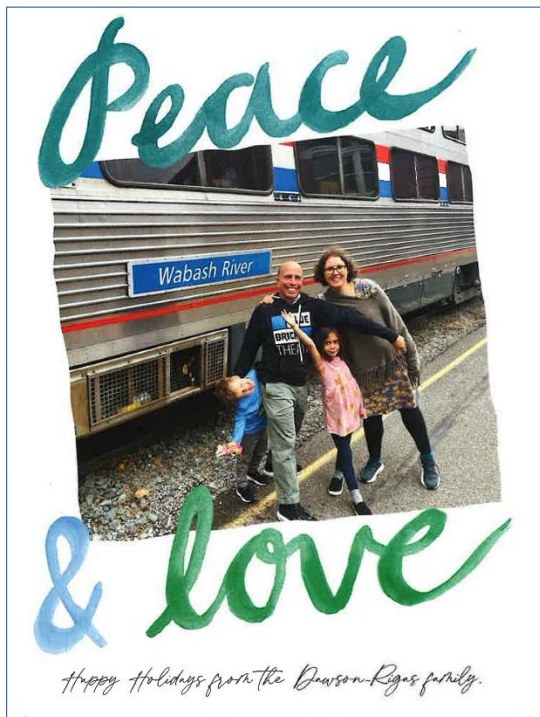
Dear family and friends:

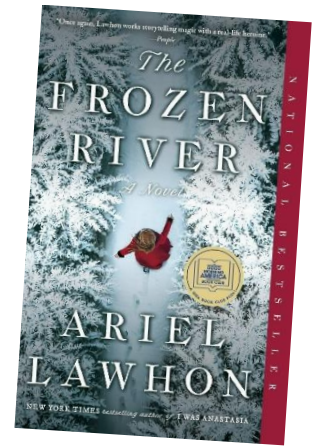
BOOK CLUB
