VESTRY UPDATE, Rick Hoover, Clerk of the Vestry July, 2018



The July vestry meeting was held on Tuesday, July 10. Income for June was light, and again expenses exceeded income. However, the overall financial picture for the year is still positive. In general, contributions are down over the summer due to vacation travel, and vestry continues to urge everyone to meet pledge commitments even if not able to attend regular services. St. Andrew's continues to operate during the summer, and your regular financial support is needed in order to sustain the many active ministries of the church. If you cannot participate in the services in person, your contributions may be sent to the church office care of Mary Andrew. Vestry learned that in the near future, you will be able to make contributions online through the website. Watch *The Messenger* and the weekly email updates for more information!

Vestry continued the discussion about Sunday service times, and based on input from parish meetings and data from surveys, vestry agreed with Fr. Jeff and supported his decision to return to the "old" schedule of Sunday services as 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., and 5:00 p.m. The vestry thanks everyone who participated in the discussions and surveys, and it especially thanks the committee that organized and shepherded the decision process.

We saw a big drop in donations for the month of June which is all too predictable for this time of year. Although some expense drops off in the summer, we do continue to pay salaries, insurance, and our assessment to the diocese (Fair Share is \$6,302/month) at the same rate.

I'd like to draw your attention to the sign-up sheet for flower contributions on the bulletin board in the narthex. There are still quite a few slots open for the year and you may wish to dedicate the floral arrangements on the altar to commemorate some special occasion or person. Our cost for the arrangements is \$60 per week, and we would appreciate any contributions toward this amount that you may wish to make.

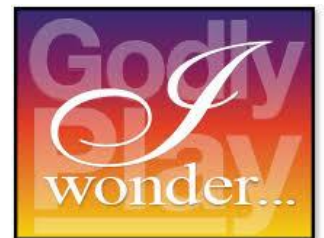


CHURCH SCHOOL

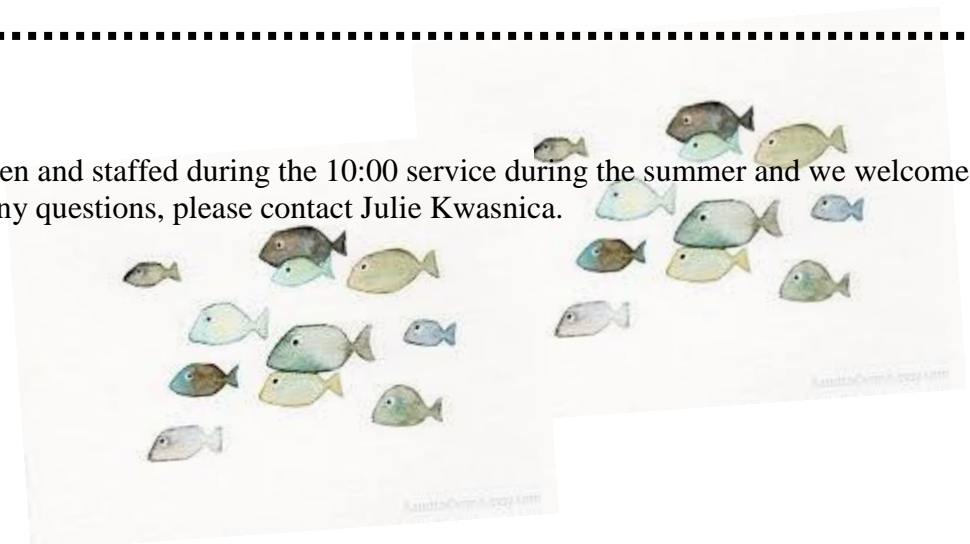


3rd-5th Grade

MUSIC AT ST. ANDREW'S

YOUTH CHOIR AT ST. ANDREWS

Wednesday, August 22

The Youth Choir at St. Andrew's is a long-standing organization in the church. As September nears we are ready to resume its work in the church. The choir is open to children ages 7-14. In addition to musical and singing skills, the group is an arm of our educational ministry for children. They will learn about the worship services and their place in them, about the texts they sing, and many more things related to their growth in the church.

Helen Kemp, a nationally famous children's choir director, had this as her mantra: "Body, mind, spirit, voice. It takes a whole person to rejoice."

In the Youth Choir we take her statement very seriously, but we know that singing is fun too, so we attempt to install a sense of the joy and wonder of singing in every child.



What are the benefits of the youth choir? First, it gives children an opportunity to serve their church. Sunday school, Vacation Bible school, and other activities minister to children, but joining a choir gives children a chance to minister to others through music. Second, participation in a choir gives children an opportunity to take a leadership role in the service. It gives them a sense of responsibility for the ministry of the church and helps them identify with the traditional form of worship as they grow to adulthood. Third, children's choirs provide opportunities to build Christian character. A choir is a team with a common goal; the qualities of promptness, cooperation, and commitment are to be developed in choir members if the group is to accomplish its purpose of praising the Lord. Fourth, children's choirs are part of the education process. When children sing Scripture, they remember it for a lifetime. Reflecting on the message of the song as they sing instills understanding of spiritual truths and knowledge of God. Children learn a skill that will last them a lifetime.

Need more reasons to sing in the choir? Well....:

1. You never have to worry about what to wear.
2. You have excellent seats and a reserved seat on all major holidays—including Christmas Eve and Easter!
3. Offering plate is never passed to the choir.
4. It's exactly like singing in the shower, except you're wearing a robe people are actually listening.
5. Sitting with a group in the chancel every Sunday is excellent practice in case you're ever called for jury duty.
6. Serving others--the congregation really loves it when the choir leads the singing.
7. Singing in a choir is one of the few activities for men that does not require complex electronics equipment or expensive power tools. This could be good for the family budget.
8. Intellectual Stimulation—when you make music, you are using both sides of your brain simultaneously.
9. Singing in choir allows us to participate in something that is so much bigger than our selves.

LYRA: A Concert of Russian Orthodox Church Music

On Friday, September 28, LYRA, an acappella group of six professional vocalists from St. Petersburg, Russia, will present a concert of Russian choral music at St. Andrew's. The first part of the concert - sacred music of Russian Orthodox church, includes ancient songs to works of famous masters and little-known but remarkable Russian composers of three centuries. The second part of their program is made up of Russian folk songs: comic, lyric, dancing, love songs. This is a wonderful opportunity to share the enormous Russian musical heritage and enjoy the sounds of Russia as interpreted by real Russians. All the singers are professionals singing in different professional choirs and opera houses of St. Petersburg.

On Friday, September 14, pianist Nathan Carterette from Pittsburgh will present a concert of the GOLDBERG VARIATIONS by Johann Sebastian Bach, at St. Andrew's. His innovative programming has inspired audiences to approach unfamiliar music with open ears, and familiar music with new appreciation. Mr Carterette has performed in such venues as Weill Recital Hall and the Yamaha Piano Salon of New York City, the Gasteig in Munich, the Museum für Kunst und Gewerbe of Hamburg, and Cleveland's Trinity Cathedral. He has been presented in several universities such as the Berklee School of Music, Cleveland Institute of Music, Radford University, Kent State University, Baldwin Wallace Conservatory, and Carnegie Mellon.
