What Will the Fall Be Like?

The above question is driving me crazy? Normally, during the quiet summer months we would be planning for the fall programs in the church. At this point, it feels like we can plan all we want to, but there's no real way of knowing what life in State College will be like in the fall. But don't think we are doing nothing. We are trying to plan as much as we can, but we are so aware that no matter how carefully we plan, it all may change in an instant. Maybe that's a good lesson for all of us to be aware of, that nothing in life is guaranteed, but it's no way to run a parish!

I just realized that four out of the six sentences in the paragraph I just wrote have the word "but" in them. That's not very good writing style, **but** it is a sign of the times. (It's six out of eight now, if you're keeping a running total.)

Acknowledging that everything these days is tentative and conditional, here's a brief summary of what we are working on.

Worship

There's no reason to think that we will have a change in our worship schedule before the end of the year. Facebook Live at 10 a.m. and in-person worship at 5 p.m. seems like it will be the Sunday schedule for some time to come. As I write this, the governor has cut back indoor gatherings to no more than 25. We were hovering around that number before, and maybe creeping up. I am

thinking about doing an outdoor service for the blessing of the animals. We will, of course, continue all our other online offerings.

Christian Formation

A recent survey of our teachers and parents of children and youth showed that almost none of them was willing to come back for in-person classes. They are largely interested and willing to do online classes. Kathy Hickner, our director of children and youth programs, is working with teachers and families to develop an online formation program for this fall.

Adult Formation will likely continue to be an occasional offering through Zoom

Music

We have begun to work on an online offering for the Festival of Lessons and Carols. It is not likely we will be back to unrestricted in-person worship by Christmas, and this holiday season favorite brings such joy. We just can't imagine the run up to Christmas without it. So, we are addressing technical challenges to record members of our choir. It may be a smaller service than usual, like five lessons instead of nine, but we will do our best to make a joyful noise to the Lord and to invite members of our community to be part of it. Look at that! I managed to write the rest of

this article without using the word "but."
