A Time for Discernment

You may have heard by now that our diocese, the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania, is considering a reunification with the Diocese of Bethlehem. This effort has been underway for some time now with a resolution being passed at our 2022 diocesan convention that created a discernment committee of folks from both dioceses to study the question and report back to the convention of 2023. With that report came a recommendation to continue looking at the possibility of reunification, to develop a specific plan for that to happen, and to present that plan to the two dioceses at their 2024 conventions. The reason for the specific plan is not to proceed as if this decision to reunify is a done deal, but rather to have all our questions answered as to how reunification might take place before we decide whether or not to do this. I repeat, the decision to reunify these two dioceses has not been made yet; it will not be made until the two diocesan conventions consider the specific plan this October. At that time, one or both dioceses in question could approve the reunification and adopt the plan (or some version of it), or one or both could reject either the idea to reunify or some aspect of the presented plan.

The reason we talk about "reunification" is that previously these two dioceses were one under the name "Diocese of Central Pennsylvania." The history is presented really well on the web site dedicated to the work of the reunification discernment committee, available here https://reunificationdiobethdiocpa.org/. Also, on that site is an excellent Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) section. If you have questions about this process, the committee and its work, or what proposals are being discussed currently, it is probably answered in the FAQ. I commend it to you if you have any interest at all in this topic.

Our diocesan convention will be held October 18-19 this year at the Penn Stater Hotel and Conference Center. The convention for the Diocese of Bethlehem will be concurrent and at the same location. If approved, the plan (as it currently stands) will have 2025 function as a transition year with the intention being that in January 2026 the two dioceses will become one. The name of this potential new diocese has not yet been determined, but they have kicked around the idea of "the Diocese of the Susquehanna," the river that flows through both current dioceses.

The biggest question on folks' minds seems to be, "why reunify?" The obvious answer is to reunify in response to the changing conditions in the Episcopal Church, and pretty much every church for that matter. We are shrinking. Our congregations and our buildings are aging. Therefore, having two dioceses with the required personnel and infrastructure is getting more expensive per congregation or per congregant. There is an economy of scale to downsizing at the diocesan level. Again, this is all covered much better than I ever could on the above referenced web site. For me, though, there is a kind of inevitability about this. Not to sound fatalistic or even defeatist, but we will have no choice at some point. It seems better to make deliberate decisions when choices are not made for us by circumstances. I do support the plan as I have seen it presented so far. There are many challenges to be faced by having a larger diocese in area covered by one bishop, but there are ways to address these challenges and we can point to several other dioceses that already cope well with even larger areas. I invite your attention to this process and of course your prayers as we continue to discern how God is calling us to act in this present moment.




This Summer in Church School

From Paige and Mary Andrew

In late January 1995, the Andrew family arrived in State College with four inches of snow on the ground and much more to come, arriving from Athens, Georgia where Paige landed his first librarian position at the University of Georgia. Ian was just four years old, and Colin would turn one a week later, also the first day of Paige's long career with the Penn State University Libraries. We joined St. Andrew's within the first month after arriving and were warmly welcomed by Jean Shirey and Robin Bagby amongst others. Soon, we were Coffee Hour volunteers, kickstarting a call to volunteer within the church in numerous different capacities.

Some family milestones in the 29 years living in Lemont include: participating in our boys' progress within the State College Area School District system and seeing each graduate high school, along with similarly participating in St.



Andrews' educational/formation processes; many years of Cub and Boy Scouts for the boys and for us as adult leaders and especially seeing Colin achieve the rank of Eagle Scout; Paige achieving tenure and promotion in 2001, promotion to Librarian rank in 2012 and retiring last September with as Emeritus Librarian; Mary's step-by-step successes with different Colleges at Penn State as their Financial Officer and now a member of the university's SIMBA team; witnessing Ian's graduation from Penn State with a bachelors degree in Hospitality Management in 2012; plus too many activities and trips to list here.

Within St. Andrew's parish, highlights for us include Colin's baptism, Mary's reception into the Episcopal church, Ian's confirmation and witnessing so many special moments with all of you from baptisms to graduations to marriages to ordinations to memorial services. As members of St. Andrew's we are so blessed by the faith and fellowship of our church leaders and many, many individuals who are fellow church family.

We were asked to share what ways we have served St. Andrew's during our time here. In some cases Mary and I have shared a particular mission such as serving as ushers, coffee hour hosts and counters together. But, just as God has planned for us, our areas of service have been pretty diverse. Mary has served as a church school teacher, J2A and Rite 13 leader, Treasurer, member of the Financial and Investment Committees and most recently as St. Andrews' Financial Secretary. Meanwhile, Paige got involved with the Property Committee early on starting simply with volunteering to help with tasks but later leading as Co-Chair and then Chair of the committee. He served on Vestry and had two significant roles during that time, co-chairing and overseeing the renovation and repair of the church's roof coping stones and roof repairs and the Property Committee and co-chairing a successful Rector's search resulting in Father Richard's appointment to St. Andrew's. Besides ushering Paige has also been a long-time Lector, coordinated the renovations of all of our stained glass windows (as the final 2006-2009 Capital Campaign project), coordinated and participated in many spring and fall "cleanup days" plus put in many hours weeding, pruning, and similar tasks around church and Trinity House grounds. For a couple of years many years ago, with Mary's and others' help, coordinated St. Andrew's groups to raise money for the church working at venues such as Spikes Baseball (concession stand), selling Apple Dumplings at State High home football games and Penn State special events at the Bryce Jordan Center.

Some of you are already aware of the next stop in our life's journey but others are not. We purchased the



Andrew house in Richland, Washington in January 2021 soon after Paige's father moved in with his sister in Spokane and it has been a rental property up until April 2024. Now we look forward to moving in and making it our new home. Richland is part of Tri-Cities, the three cities being Richland and Kennewick on the south side of the Columbia River and Pasco on the north. We finally will be within driving distance to participate in family events in person. We especially want to spend as much quality time as possible with our two living parents (Paige's father and Mary's mother) both of whom are in their early nineties.

There are no words to express how grateful we are to have been involved in the life of the St. Andrew's parish. We have been blessed in so many ways and by so many of you and we will take away much more than we ever gave. St. Andrew's has been our rock and anchor throughout so many good times and difficult/stressful times in our lives. We have garnered a lifetime of memories by being a part of this church too and will greatly miss you all. As you can imagine, this is a very emotional time for both of us. Most of all we ask your prayers for continued good health and many retirement years ahead. And in return we will always keep St. Andrew's in our prayers as well.

The Rev. Larry John Hofer

September 9, 1939 – May 28, 2024

The Rev. Larry John Hofer passed away on May 28, 2024, at the Delaware Hospice Center in Milford, DE, in the company of family and after 84 years of a selfless life. He was born in Toledo, OH, on September 9, 1939, to the late Mary (Emch) and Harry Hofer. He was predeceased by his sister, Shirley.



Larry graduated from Kenyon College in 1961, majoring in History. He received his Master of Divinity from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in 1964. He served two parishes in Pennsylvania and one in Chicago, where he was also Lutheran campus pastor at the University of Chicago. In 1987, he received a certificate in Anglican Studies from General Seminary and was ordained a priest. He served several parishes in Pennsylvania, ending at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, State College, where he worked for 14 years until his retirement in 2008. During retirement in Delaware, he held various positions in the diocese, including priest associate at St. Peter's in Lewes, priest-in-charge at St. Paul's Georgetown, and a director of diaconal formation.

Father Larry is survived by his wife of 54 years, Susan, of Lewes, DE. He is also survived by his children: Kristen (Adam) Parker of Lexington, MA, and son Eric Hofer of Port Matilda, PA, along with three grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.
