In Praise of the Arts & the Art of Praise

Don't forget to come to our poetry reading at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, July 13, the Saturday during Ats Festival. All the award winners will be here to read their works, and selected poets, plus our judge Jerry Wemple will read some from his work. Our featured poet this year is our parishioner Emily Grosholtz, a retired professor from Penn State who worked in the English and Philosophy departments. Our theme this year is "And who is my neighbor?" The reading will be hosted by Alison Jaenicke.

Why is the church sponsoring a poetry contest? You'll recall our first contest challenged poets to reflect on what God may have been up to in the midst of the pandemic. That was a moment in history and a time when we were all trying to make sense of what was happening. These contests are a way to invite people into a larger conversation related to the theme, a kind of public theology project. It is also a way for St. Andrew's to continue an old tradition in the church, that of patronizing the arts. Think: Michaelangelo's Sistine Chapel or DaVinci's Last Supper. They are beautiful representations of biblical and religious themes, and incredible works of art on their own. As patron of the arts, the church acknowledges that our God is creative, THE creator in fact, and that we were created in God's image. In other words, we were created creative. Human creativity finds expression in many of our endeavors, but especially in the arts. And art that doubles as praise of God and as an aid to worship seems doubly blessed.

At St. Andrew's we have long appreciated and supported the arts. Our music program is excellent. The sixtimes-a-year Evensong put on by our choir is a unique expression of our Anglican heritage that gives voice to some of the greatest composers of sacred music. People come from a distance to experience this lovely and holy service. Just walking into our space makes clear that art is loved here. The stained-glass windows of St. Andrew's are spectacular. Growing up here I never really appreciated them; they were just there. Now, I am spellbound by their beauty and complexity. We will show them off again in tours during the Arts Festival. Added to the windows in more recent years are the stations of the cross, beautiful depictions of ugly events. I would include our Friday Film series in this list of arts supported by our parish.

The Book of Common Prayer defines prayer as "responding to God" (BCP 856). That response may be a prayer offered with or without words. Or it could be a song or poem composed with a heart open to the divine. It could be a work of visual art that struggles to express the holy or sublime. It could be any kind of creative expression born from personal piety, ecstatic joy, or even the depths of existential angst. Sometimes the only way to express the religious impulse is in the language of art that can speak to anyone, anytime. Beauty is eternal. Through art we touch eternity.

O God, whom saints and angels delight to worship in heaven: Be ever present with your servants who seek through art and music to perfect the praises offered by your people on earth; and grant to them even now glimpses of your beauty and make them worthy at length to behold it unveiled for evermore; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (BCP 819)

Gift for Rev Kev

We are collecting money for an ordination gift to Deacon Kevin Lowe from the parish. We intend to get him a chasuble and stole combination. The chasuble is the poncho-like vestment the priest wears while presiding at the Eucharist. It is modeled after the seamless garment of Jesus that the Roman guards cast lots for rather than divide it into fourths. That garment was a common outer garment worn to protect from the weather. Along with the priest's stole it symbolizes a connection to Christ and his ministry especially the sacramental ministry of the Lord's supper.

You can donate by giving a check with the memo "Ordination Gift." We will soon set up an online category for giving as well. Any cash collected in excess of the cost of the gift will be given to (soon-to-be) Father Kevin's discretionary fund.




